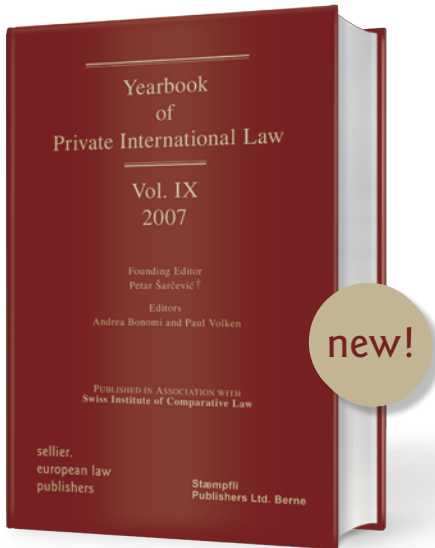

Because of the interest that this European text presents for third States, some distinguished scholars from non-European areas (the U.S., Japan, Latin America and Australia) were also asked to express their views on this important piece of Community legislation and the possible influence it may have on conflict developments in their respective countries and regions.*
